Dear Medical Volunteer,

Thank you for your interest in volunteering for the 2024 Believe the Promise (BTP) International Pathfinder Camporee in Gillette, WY. The time is fast approaching and as we get closer things will speed up and I will need lots of hands to complete much work. I look forward to working with you again or for the first time. Here is some basic information that I hope will answer at least some of your questions. Feel free to contact me with additional questions as others may have the same question.

Basic Information:

- I will need volunteers beginning on Sunday before the official start of the camporee and through Sunday after the official end of the camporee.
- I will need help in setting up the medical complex, sorting supplies, and being available to provide medical care to the volunteers who are setting up.
- The Medical Team needs the following volunteers:
 - Physicians
 - Pediatricians
 - Emergency Medicine
 - Family Medicine
 - Dentists
 - Nurse Practitioners
 - Physician Assistants
 - Nurses (RN/LPN)
 - EMT
 - Paramedics
 - Certified Nursing Assistants
 - Support staff
 - Golf cart transport driver must be 18 years or older.
 - This would be someone who can take ill/injured campers back to their campsites.
- The medical building will be staffed 24/7.
- The schedule will be arranged to ensure there is a rotation to meet everyone's needs and requests and ensure the building is staffed appropriately.
 - It is imperative you show up for the shifts you agree to work.
- Golf carts will be assigned to Paramedic/EMT teams to roam the grounds and respond to medical needs. These will be coordinated by the EMS coordinator team.
 - Keys will be signed out and signed back in
- Radio sign out will be securely managed. We absolutely cannot afford to have lost or stolen radios.
- The medical leadership will each have a golf cart for response and support as well.

- If you are volunteering as licensed personnel, you must have a current license in the state of your residence as a minimum.
- You must be licensed in the US.
- Please make sure you complete a Camporee Volunteer Application and purchase a Camporee Volunteer Ticket and you indicate your area of service is medical.
- Please subscribe to the online newsletter as more information will be coming out and this is where to find it centrally located.
- Each Camporee has had it's own special medical problem constipation because of the fear of using port-o-lets; heat related issues; asthma, diabetes; and drama.
- If you are the medical support person for your particular club, we will look to you to help manage your club issues, injuries as best as possible and the medica team is always available.
- It is important to know and understand when large groups of pre-teen and teenagers get together, drama will ensue. This age group tends to be very dramatic and being slightly overheated quickly turns into what they believe to be an impending doom situation.
 - If this age group is ill enough that they cannot truly stand or walk, they will require more service than what we can provide.
 - We will function as a "no lift" service it is important to insure the medical volunteers are not injured caring for others.
 - The medical team is there to provide basic service.
 - You cannot bring your own jump bags with equipment that you would normally use on your ambulance service, with the exception of basic first aid supplies.
- If you have special supplies/equipment such as pulse oximeter, BP cuff, stethoscope, please feel free to bring them. We cannot be responsible for storing or ensuring that they are kept safe and not lost.
